#### **Road of Love**

So keep walking the road of love. This is what is needed for the times we live in. The night is almost over. The first rays of the new day are already shining! For the day when Creator will finish setting us free and making us whole is now closer than when we first began walking this road.

Romans 13:11-12

Some time ago, I (Meg) purchased a new translation of the New Testament, called the First Nations Version. It is an English translation created by a council of North American Indigenous elders, scholars, and pastors who desired to have a New Testament translation that spoke to the culture of their people. One of the translation choices I appreciate in this version is the use of "walking God's road" where most English translations would have "kingdom of God." In this passage in particular, they have chosen "road of love."

I find this phrasing helpful because it is so active. In the kingdom of God, some may mistakenly believe that action doesn't have to be part of living our faith. On the other hand, walking the road is inherently active. A road has no purpose if there is no movement on it (as many drivers on highway 174 can attest to!). God has invited us on a journey of faith, trust, and love as we follow Jesus.

Paul's words to the Romans continue to be true for us: walking the road of love is what is needed today. Paul reminds us that every day we get closer to when God will make us whole, so we have no time to waste! At the same time, we don't need to panic, because God is in charge. We get to walk the road (as opposed to sprinting down it), at the pace we are able, with the Holy Spirit to guide and support us. The important thing is that we continue to move down the road.

Your Profile Committee has started meeting, and we are working on developing a profile that describes who Grace is as a community today, and where we think God might be leading us. Eventually, we will also include information on the type of minister we are looking for, but we first need to understand who we are.

This is where you are invited to provide input. In the next few weeks, we will be reaching out to the congregation to get your perspective on Grace Church. We want to know how Grace has helped develop your faith and how you see Grace interacting within our neighbourhood, for example. We plan to have a few different ways for people to share their experiences, including a survey and a future discussion after church. We hope that you will walk this road with us as we look at where God is calling Grace to focus our resources.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

#### Mission Moment: by Linda Clarke

Unlike other months when I write about a particular Mission that Grace Church supports financially and prayerfully, this month I want to highlight an organization that supports the evangelical church. We designate \$200 in our annual budget for EFC The Evangelical Fellowship of Canada. All of the following information has been taken from the December/January edition of 'Canada Watch' a publication of the EFC. Their website is evangelicalfellowship.ca

Centre for Faith and Public Life – This centre in Ottawa brings biblical principles to bear on law and public policy, witnessing through constructive engagement in public life in areas like:

Prostitution/sexual exploitation

Religious freedom

Protecting kids online

Euthanasia

Online harms/hate crimes

Centre for Ministry Partnership and Innovation – This centre facilitates collaboration between EFC affiliates and partners to support ministries, denominations, educational institutions and congregations across Canada. They find innovative ways to respond to felt needs and challenges.

Abuse awareness and prevention network

Canadian Christian women's network

Our common calling

Welcome church

Centre for Research on Church and Faith – This centre conducts ministry research for their affiliates and in partnership with them to help frontline ministry workers make better informed decisions and to help those outside our movement understand them.

Women in the Canadian Evangelical Church study

Identifying evangelicals

Update on Canada's most immediate issues that EFC is working on:

At the Supreme Court – in support of the current prostitution laws which protect human dignity and promote equality. Protecting kids online webinars – these webinars provide parents with helpful information, tools and strategies for keeping kids safer in online spaces.

Preventing image-based abuse – EFC asked the Justice Committee to support a bill that helps prevent consequences for those whose images of abuse have been posted online.

Religious freedom court case – the rental agreement of a faith-based organization was cancelled by a Quebec cabinet minister because of the organization's beliefs.

Charitable status for advancing religion – The EFC has written to the minister of finance outlining the significance and benefit of religious charities in Canada and urging him not to adopt two committee recommendations that could potentially remove charitable status from faith-based charities.

EFC has a new video series called 'Faith Matters'. They consider how Christians can speak compassionately and effectively into our country's public life and how Scripture should inform our thinking on key issues. To find out more – TheEFC.ca/FaithMatters

#### **Operation Christmas Child Update**



God did amazing things around the world through Operation Christmas Child in 2024! We thank Him that **11.9 million shoeboxes** were prayerfully packed and collected. That means millions of children will have the opportunity to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ and be discipled in 2025!

In 2024 11,927,439 shoebox gifts were packed by people from 11 countries. 5.5 million children participated in the greatest journey and 3.2 million decisions were made for Christ.
